

BRIEF CURRICULUM VITAE

Dr Triada Chatzigeorgiou has been a member of the Laboratory Teaching Staff of the Department of Cultural Technology and Communication, School of Social Sciences, University of the Aegean since October 2017, having completed her transfer from Secondary Education, where she was previously employed as a full-time teacher (transferred under Govt. Gazette vol. 3, no. 993/09.10.2017 and Rector's Act A.Π.4061 / 12.10.2017).

She is a graduate of the Department of English Studies, School of Philosophy, University of Athens (1988). She studied social anthropology in the Graduate Study Programme of the Department of Social Anthropology, University of the Aegean (1989-1991).

In 2002 she was accepted as a PhD candidate in the Department of Philosophy and Social Sciences, University of Crete, completing her doctoral thesis with a grade of "Excellent" in 2006. The title of her thesis was *'Greek Pontians' from the (Former) Soviet Union: Expressions of Identity and Socialisation in Greece* [412pp.]

She served on the teaching staff (PD 407) of the University of the Aegean, alongside her work in secondary education (2008-2009 and 2009-2010 academic years). Specifically, she was employed on fixed-term teaching contracts under private law, covered by article 5 of Presidential Decree **407/80**, in the Department of Cultural Technology and Communication, School of Social Sciences, University of the Aegean, as an independent instructor teaching the courses "Multiculturalism and Identities" and "Cultural Theory II".

She served as School Activities Coordinator of the Directorate of Secondary Education of Lesvos Prefecture (2013-2014 school year to October 2017).

She was also employed on a contract (2014-2015 and 2015-2016 academic years) as a Laboratory Assistant, supervising Classroom Teaching Practices (PAD) at the School of Pedagogical and Technological Education (ASPETE) of Mytilene, as part of the Annual Pedagogical Training Programme (EPPAIK) and the Programme of Specialisation in Counselling and Guidance (PESYP).

At present, as a member of the Laboratory Teaching Staff of the Department of Cultural Technology and Communication, she teaches the following courses of the University of the Aegean: 'Cultural Theory I', 'Cultural Theory II', 'Multiculturalism and Identities', 'Memory and Identities'.

Dr Chatzigeorgiou's main fields of interest (research / papers / publications) are Social and Cultural Identities, Migration, Symbolic Boundaries/Borders, Collective/Social Memory, Cultural Representations of Identity.
