# Learning outcomes

Upon completion of the course, Students are expected:

To get them to become acquainted with analytical concepts such as identity, difference, otherness/alterity, symbolic boundaries, transmigration, hybridity, social space, gender, etc.

To discern between multiculturalism and cultural pluralism and consider that multiculturalism entails practices, strategies and discourses concerning political recognition of social and cultural identities.

To be provided with a general overview of the basic themes and issues related to the concept of identity and realize the important role it plays in the analysis of social phenomena.

To regard identity and identification not as an essence but as a process: multiple identities composing individual as well as collective subjects are never a final or settled matter.

To consider the concepts of identity and otherness as interdependent and to recognize that the collective action of group members who believe they share a common identity develops always in relation to other collectivities in an ongoing process of interaction and negotiation of terms and boundaries. In the context of this relationship some "differences" are considered to be of greater significance than others.

To become familiar with the basic terminology of social sciences associated with migration in order to refer to the relevant theoretical approaches and use the respective research/methodological practices.

To get them to become acquainted with a frame of knowledge which points out that social structures, push and pull factors, state and transnational policies and agreements -issues that have become crucial to the early studies of migration - have been coexisting since the 1990s with approaches focusing on cultural perceptions, practices and experiences of migrants themselves.

To consider gender as a decisive factor in individual and collective choices and plans, as shifting gender relations reflect and at the same time are influenced by the changing economic, political and social contexts of temporary or permanent establishment.

To distinguish the contribution of theoretical approaches in studying differentiation and change occurred under various circumstances associated with the presence of otherness in social life.

(3) SYLLABUS

### **SYLLABUS**

The contemporary reality of various groups' presence in western societies claiming recognition of social and political rights has raised issues of identities as crucial arguments in the discourses about multiculturalism. This course attempts to review the key points of the debate about multiculturalism. Moreover, it presents the recent debate about identity in the social sciences and highlights and analyzes, among others: a) the relation of similarity and difference always required for identity construction b) the interactive relationship between personal and collective identity, c) the role of classifications, of internal self-identification as well as of external categorization process which are developed mutually in the context of the current and often unequal distribution of power in a given political and historical context. This constantly changing identification process entails practices, strategies and discourses, which strengthen or question the sense of belonging to a particular cultural identity. The contemporary presence of migrant groups in western societies has become more intense in the second half of the 20th century as it is connected with the ongoing process of globalization. The course presents the main theoretical and methodological approaches concerning the study of post-war migration to western Europe and the USA. It also provides an introduction to recent research and theoretical approaches which, focusing on migration to Greece of the late twentieth and early twenty-first century, explore the construction of migrant identities from a gender perspective,

The course is divided into thirteen lectures. The weekly schedule of the course topics is presented in detail during the first lecture and remain available in the e-class of the course afterwards.
