Led the **Urban Nature Directorate** with 400+ staff and a multi-million euro annual budget. Introduced a clear vision linking urban nature to Climate Adaptation and created a motivated, efficient and effective 9-member leadership team. Spearheaded collaborative processes with citizens, experts and municipal staff in planning, designing and implementing neighborhood parks, urban agriculture and an urban forest. Introduced the first digital data monitoring for green and grey infrastructure regarding temperature, humidity and pollution. Key Achievements:

- Athens received the European Innovation Capital 2018 award (€1M prize) which was partially based on work by the Office of Resilience and Sustainability.
- Athens was the first city to receive the Natural Capital Finance Facility (€5M) and free technical assistance (€500.000) through a European Investment Bank loan, in order to design and implement 4 blue/green infrastructure projects and build capacity within the public and private sectors.
- Athens pioneered in introducing the Extrema App, a phone application which gives real-time personalized information regarding Athenians' level of risk during extreme weather conditions and

proposes the nearest available shelters for the most vulnerable. The Extrema App was adopted by Paris, Rotterdam and Milan.

- Athens: Leading the Cool Cities Network: in Dec. 2018 Athens was selected by the C40 Cities Climate Leadership Group to lead the Cool Cities Network.
